

is bounded by Edmonds Street to the northwest, 6th Street to the northeast, 10th Avenue to the southeast and Kingsway to the southwest.




Population

In 2006, there were 6,485 people living in private households in the Edmonds neighbourhood representing 3% of Burnaby's population in private households¹ (200,195).

The neighbourhood's population has increased by 39% since 1986 compared to 41% for the city as a whole.












Housing Tenure

Households spending 30% or more of total monthly household income on shelter






Families


Income
